





Provenance: Major General G.J. Hamilton whose family seat is at Hamwood, Co. Meath. General Hamilton's father, Frederick, his uncle Charles and five maiden aunts grew up at Hamwood. General Hamilton inherited a large collection of furniture and art from the five aunts, who raised him as a boy in Ireland while his parents were in India. Two of the aunts were well known Irish artists, Letitia Marion Hamilton and Eva Hamilton, whose work can be found in the National Collection. He studied medicine with his father and at Steevens's Hospital, Dublin and graduated at the University of Edinburgh in 1814. He studied at Paris until Napoleon's return from Elba. He subsequently pursued his studies in London. In 1819 he returned to Dublin, and became demonstrator of anatomy at Trinity College. Jacob joined with Graves and others in founding the Park Street School of Medicine. In 1826 he was elected professor of anatomy in the Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland, and held the chair until 1869. He was three times chosen president of the college. In 1832, in conjunction with Charles Benson and others, he established the City of Dublin Hospital. 




