








3 Map of Dublin after John Speed.

Speed's 1610 map of Dublin reprinted in the early 19th century and overwritten with ink and wash. Framed. €100-€150







A brass rectangular convex shoulder belt plate engraved to the centre with a crown over Maid of Erin, between G" and "R", ribbons inscribed above and below "DRUMKEEN" and "INFANTRY", hook and pair of fixing studs to reverse. Rare." €1,000-€1,500





## 24 Circa 1790. Lisburn Volunteers shoulder belt plate.

A gilt rectangular shoulder belt plate engraved to the centre with a crown over Maid of Erin harp, inscribed IN PECTORE PATRIA" above and "LISBURN / VOLUNTEERS" below, hook and pair of fixing studs to reverse. Rare." €1,200-€1,500





# 25 Circa 1790. Lurgan Infantry shoulder belt plate.






# 1801 (1 January to 28 August). Diary compiled by Augustus-Abraham Hely-Hutchinson













### The Truth of their Case

#### DETAINED AS SAFEGUARD

DETAINED AS SAFEGUARD

The captured Irregulars now in Mountjoy are detained there not as a punitive
measure, BUT IN ORDER TO SAFEGUARD THE IRISH PEOPLE.

These men were taken in arms in the
act of making war on the Irish people.
In arms they inflicted the maximum loss
in their power on trish lives and property.
After UNCONDITIONAL surrender they
proceeded to wreak further injury on Irish
property by breaking up the prison in
which they were confined. By these
means they carried out a systematic
programme of wanton destruction. They
broke through the partition walls of their
cells (quite unnecessarily, since the
doors are open day and night); they
amushed the windows and removed the
bars, they tore down a large part of the
wire screens in the galleries, they broke
up the books in the store cells. up the sanitary appliances, they even tore up the books in the store cells.

#### SIGNALLING FROM WINDOWS

SiGNALLING FROM WINDOWS
From the broken windows of their cells (sometimes employing as step-ladders the up-rooted gratings) the prisoners were able to signal to friends outside. They were repeatedly warned to stop this, but refused to desist. At length they were informed that unless they ceased at once they would be fired on, and, finally, the threat had to be carried out. One man was slightly wounded in the arm by a builtet, and another received a scratch on the back of the bead from a piece of brick broken off by the firing. SIGNALLING THEN CEANED.

#### TUNNEL COMMENCED

IUNNEL COMMENCED
It was now discovered that they had
begin to dig a tunnel to meet that which
was being constructed by would-be
rescuers. It therefore became necessary
to remove the prisoners to safer quarters.
In the process they were searched, and
various weapons, FROM IRON BARS TO
BOMBS, were found in their possession.
They have now undertaken to behave
themselves, and the maximum of comfort
and liberty, CONSISTENT WITH THEIR
SAFE KEEPING, is allowed to them.

With their diet the public is already familiar. The prisoners are supplied with knile, fork, spoon, plate, and mug. Their bedding consists of a mattress, pillow, and three blankers, and each has soap and a towel. Two prisoners occupy each cell, and the cell doors are never closed. The doors leading to the recreation grounds are open all day, so that they have no lack of fresh air. They are allowed one letter in and one letter out per week. They can have as many parcels as are sent to them, and their own representatives are present when these are examined by the censor.

#### NO VISITORS OR PAROLE NOW

It has been found impossible to allow any visitors to the prisoners, and if parole is refused they are themselves to blame. THE FIRST MAN WHO GAVE HIS PAROLE WAS SUBSEQUENTLY SEARCHED, AND A MILITARY MESSAGE WAS FOUND IN HIS STOCKING. It should be mentioned here that on one occasion a bomb was found by the guard placed against the main gate of the prison. There is a doctor always available for the prisoners, but his services are hordly ever required. Mass is always said on Sundays, and prisoners of any denonination can always have the services of their clergy for the asking.


